That the idol is any thing, or that which is offered in sacrifice to idols is any thing? But I say, that the things which the Gentiles sacrifice, they sacrifice to devils, and not to God: and I would not that ye should have fellowship with devils. Ye cannot drink the cup of the Lord, and the cup of devils: ye cannot be partakers of the Lord’s table, and of the table of devils” (1 Cor. 10:19-20). “Ye know that ye were Gentiles, carried away unto these dumb idols, even as ye were led” (1 Cor. 12:2). “And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people” (2 Cor. 6:16). “For they themselves

shew of us what manner of entering in we had unto you, and how ye turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God (1 Thess. 1:9). “*Little children, keep yourselves from idols. Amen*” (1 John 5:21, see Exodus 20:4, Leviticus 26:1, Deut. 4:15-18, 28, 7:25, Psalm 115, Isaiah 42:8, Jeremiah 10:5, Acts 17:22-31, Rev. 2:14, 9:20).

There must come a time in our life where we need to compare what we believe spiritually with what the Bible says. That is done only by faithfully reading the Bible and the Bible alone. If we want spiritual truth, we must study the Scriptures. How else are we going to know about God?
